MEDITATION

Sunday, June 14, 2026

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

How much more . . . (Romans 5:9)

This passage can seem so complex that we might feel tempted to gloss over it. But don't! Spend a little time with it, and you'll see that it is filled with words of great encouragement and promise.

First, Paul explains that Jesus offered himself up for us "while we were still helpless" (Romans 5:6). He admits that we were trapped in sin and unable to pull ourselves out of it. If anything, we kept digging ourselves into a deeper hole. But, Paul proclaims, that's what makes Jesus' sacrifice so astounding. *He gave his life for me when I was in such a sorry state!*

Paul says, in fact, that this is how God "proves" how much he loves us: "While we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Jesus' cross forever stands as the evidence that no matter how selfish and prideful we may be, God still loves us. He still wants to rescue us and restore us to himself.

Having explained how God proves his love for us, Paul goes on to describe the confidence this love can give us. And he does it by stacking one rhetorical question on top of another: if Jesus has rescued us by his death, *how much more* will he protect us from "the wrath" that sin produces in the world (Romans 5:9)? *How much more* "will be saved" from every evil in this world (Romans 5:10)? How much more indeed! There's no limit to his love.

So, every time you catch yourself wondering whether you are "good enough" for Jesus to love you, remember those three words: *how much more!* Remember the cross. Remember the love that moved him to give himself up to death—for you. Gaze upon the cross and let Jesus tell you how valuable and how precious you are to him. Then stand tall and joyfully "boast" to yourself about the love that God has for you. (Romans 5:11). Rejoice in the love that redeems and reconciles and saves and heals. The love that does so *much more*.

Let us respond to God's love with generous hearts.

The theme of God's unending love for us, his people, runs through our readings today. Saint Paul points out that Christ died for us *while we were still sinners*, and Jesus' *heart was moved with pity* when he saw the troubled crowd. Let us strive to imitate this great love by obeying Jesus' instruction in the Gospel: *Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.*
