MEDITATION

June 16, 2024

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We walk by faith, not by sight. (2 Corinthians 5:7)

Ruth was struggling with her teenage children. She loved them and prayed for them and set healthy boundaries for them, but their irritability and poor choices made her feel that she wasn't doing enough. Some days she even wondered if she was failing as a parent.

Then one morning she read this verse from St. Paul during her prayer time: "We walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). As she read it, she felt a nudge from God to read it again. As she reflected on the things she was viewing "by sight," especially her children's struggles and her own doubts about herself, she felt God prompting her to see them "by faith" instead.

Ruth thought about how often she had reminded her children that she loved them and that God loved them. She thought about how she brought them to Mass every week, where they received Jesus' Body and Blood in Communion. She thought about how she had taught them to apologize and offer forgiveness to one another, and how they did it, even if it was begrudging at times!

Ruth also reflected on the passages from God's word that had meant so much to her, verses like Isaiah 54:13: "All your children shall be taught by the Lord; great shall be the peace of your children." And Matthew 13:31-32, where Jesus describes how the smallest seed can produce the largest of plants. Closing her Bible, Ruth's heart felt lighter and her mind felt clearer.

Think about a burden you are carrying today. Now, ponder today's words from St. Paul: "We walk by faith, not by sight." How is the Lord inviting you to view that situation by faith? Perhaps you could search out or recall Scripture passages that give you a renewed perspective. God has given you the gift of faith, and he is so pleased when you use it!

"Lord, open my eyes to see your presence and your faithfulness."

In Celebration of Graduations, the following excerpt from Sr. Paul Mary from her École Saint-Louis, remembrances. "The school was all staffed by sisters and then we got our first lay teacher. Dorothy Murphy, a graduate from St. Joseph's Academy. She was one of the first lay teachers in the parochial schools and I don't know how we managed to pay her. She taught 3rd and 4th. Sr. Christine taught 5th and 6th. Sr. Severina taught 1st and 2nd grade – she was a wonderful teacher. I was at the school for five or six years. This was my first experience as a principal. I really didn't expect the things that other more experienced people would have expected. Of course, the idea of a secretary was impossible so I was my own secretary, which wasn't too bad. The only phone was in my office so whenever the telephone rang or there was somebody at the back door or the front door or playground door (the classroom had three doors: one led into the library, one that led out to the front, and one that led out to the back door), it was usually for me. So, I would have to tell the class (7th and 8th) to just work on their math or they do oral reading as much as they could or if they were reading a book to continue reading and they had been doing this for years. It was a tradition that if the principal had to leave the room they would just carry on; they did not take this time to play or talk, it was carry on with what you were doing. One time, we were reading the story of Ichabod Crane, about Sleepy Hollow, and I would read sections of it just so they could get more of the flavorso they could enjoy the humor of the writings. This particular time I left the room, I gave the book to Pat Warner
