MEDITATION

Sunday, November 2, 2025

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed
ALL SOULS' DAY

This is the will of the one who sent me. (John 6:39)

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us it's his Father's will that "everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life" (John 6:40). *Everyone* who believes in Jesus! God the Father, who created us in love, wants us to experience his love forever. He deeply desires that everyone be saved. Today, on All Souls' Day, the whole Church prays in accord with the expressed will of God: that all the souls in purgatory will see Jesus and finally be received into the perfect joy of heaven. How much hope this can give us!

How encouraging, too, that our Father's mercy extends beyond our comprehension. He is so merciful that he even allows everyone who dies "in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified" to continue to undergo purification—all so that we can receive eternal life (*Catechism*, 1030)!

God wants us to have this hope of eternal life both for ourselves *and* for our loved ones. As St. Paul writes in our second reading, "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5). Our hope is rooted in our faith in a loving, merciful God. We know that Jesus died and rose for us so that everyone could be saved (5:10). So we trust in that same love and mercy for our loved ones, just as we do for ourselves.

As you pray for all the souls in purgatory at Mass today, ask God to fill you with hope. Let him remind you of his everlasting love for you and for all those who have already passed away. As the celebrant lifts up the host and chalice, thank God for sending Jesus so that "everyone" may see him and believe in him. He has promised to raise us "on the last day" (John 6:40)—and that's a promise we can put our faith in!

"Lord Jesus, Savior of the world, I place my hope in you!"
