FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

MEDITATION

Sunday, October 26, 2025

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Lord . . . knows no favorites. (Sirach 35:12)

Many siblings joke with—or taunt—each other about being their mother’s or father’s “favorite.” Their parents will protest that they have no favorites. And although it’s true that they love each of their children deeply, it’s natural to have preferences. That’s why siblings sometimes engage in friendly competition to win over Mom or Dad.

So, it can be hard to believe Sirach when he tells us that God “knows no favorites” (35:12). But it’s true! There is nothing any of us can do to convince the Lord that He should love us more than someone else. If anything, his heart goes out more to the oppressed and lowly, and their prayer “pierces the clouds” (35:17). Their humility and their need, not their achievements or wealth, draw God’s heart toward them.

We see this truth played out in the parable Jesus tells in today’s Gospel. When a Pharisee and a tax collector come to the Temple to pray, the Pharisee seems to think he can sway the Lord’s opinion of him with his long list of accomplishments. But it doesn’t work. Neither his status nor his resume qualifies him for special favors. The one who “went home justified,” the one who received God’s grace, was the tax collector, who approached God with humility and lowliness (Luke 18:14). He knew that he couldn’t earn God’s approval, so he admitted his need and pleaded for mercy.

The Lord knows no favorites. That’s a truth that you can hold onto today. But you can also hold onto the truth that you are a beloved child of God. Your position before him is secure. There’s nothing you can do to make him love you more. There’s nothing you have done that will make him love you less. So just come to him, trusting in his mercy, and let him love you—completely—for who you are!

Every Sunday at 10, our beautiful organ is played before, during, and after the Mass. The assembly sings appealing Psalms, hymns, and other songs of the church, led by our organist Larry Martin and cantor Mili Judge-Becker. Our cantor sings and often plays her violin or viola before and during Mass.

From September through June, our **volunteer choir** sings at the 10 a.m. Mass. We are looking for new singers.

Perhaps you'd **Love to sing with us!** Choral singing experience is helpful but not necessary. We'll help fit you into the group.

We rehearse before each Sunday Mass. Please come at 9:00 am. any Sunday. We practice in the music room upstairs over the Parish Hall from 9:00-9:40 am, before the 10:00 Mass. No evening rehearsals. We sing music within our capability, considering the size of our group and our 40 minutes of rehearsal time on Sunday mornings. Women, men, and high school students are welcome. If you enjoy singing with us, we hope you will sing regularly with us, September through June. Choir generally takes a Sunday off each month, usually the fourth Sunday of the month.
