MEDITATION

Sunday, September 21, 2025

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

No servant can serve two masters. (Luke 16:13)

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of a steward who had authority over all the resources of his master. However, he used his master's wealth and power to serve his own self-interest. When his master discovered he was squandering his property, he promptly fired the servant. His future uncertain, the servant reduced the debts owed to his master to secure favor for himself with the debtors. Although Jesus commends the steward for behaving prudently, he also tells his disciples, "You cannot serve both God and mammon" (Luke 16:13).

Jesus is clear: we can serve only God or wealth, and whichever one we choose has authority over us, for good or for all. So how can we know which "master" we are serving?

Imagine a magnificent royal throne. It might be solid gold, encrusted with rubies, or ornately carved from beautiful oak. That throne represents authority and influence; it is the seat of power from which a king rules over his servants. So, in this analogy, the "throne" represents the seat of authority over our hearts, and we can choose who will sit on that throne and reign over us. To whom will we give first place?

When our primary desires are for more money or greater worldly success and recognition, we have placed some form of "mammon" on the throne. And what fruit does that bear? What an obvious choice: Only the desire for more. We feel restless, envious, and burdened. However, when we give God first place in our hearts, everything else falls into place, and we experience peace, contentment, and a desire to serve him and our neighbor.

What an obvious choice: Jesus is not a belittling master! Rather than demanding that we place him on the throne, he offers us an invitation. *Whom will you serve today?*

So, what can you remove from the throne of your heart to make room for Jesus?

"Lord, help me to pursue you above all else today."
